Within the space of a few decades, video game technology has changed beyond recognition. From basic single-player computer games involving simple stick controls, we can now **manipulate** the movements of computer game characters with our bodies. We can even invite other people from anywhere in the world to join us in online games. So how might gaming evolve in the next few decades?

The average age of gamers has risen to about 30 in recent years. Experts agree that this trend is likely to continue.
